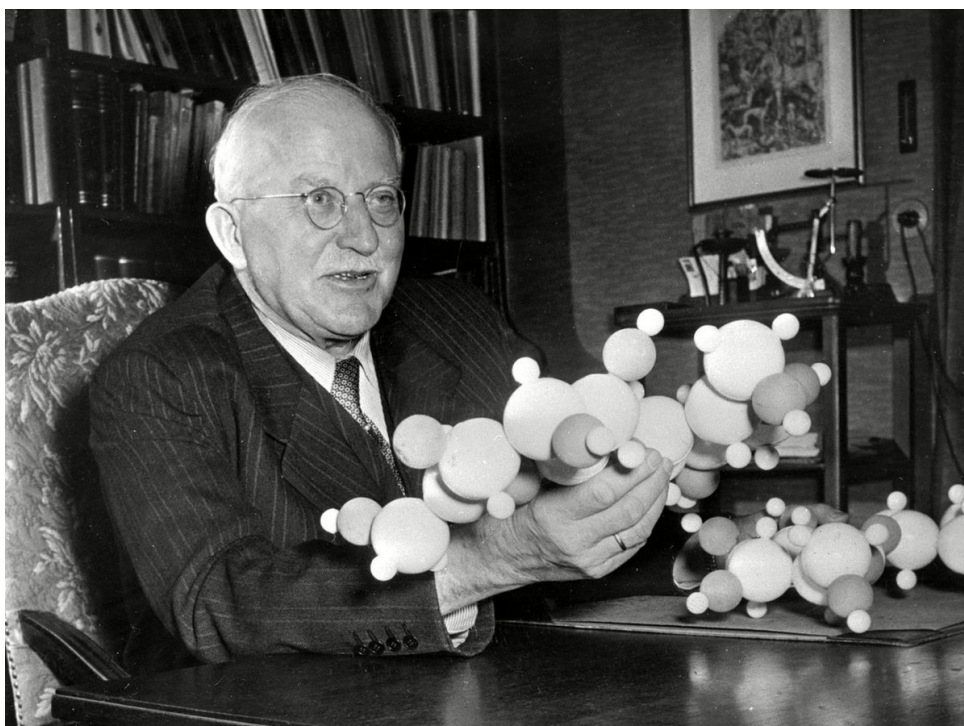


Hermann Staudinger, Macromolecules (1953)

Abstract

The chemist Hermann Staudinger (1881-1965) was the founder of macromolecular chemistry. His particular research interest was polymerization, from which complex molecular chains arose. In 1922, Staudinger coined the term “macromolecule” to describe the model he held in his hands.
