

Jacques Callot, *Les Bohémiens en marche: l'avant-garde* (1621/35)

Abstract

The Lorrainian artist Jacques Callot is mostly known for his depictions of the horrors of the Thirty Years War. This copper engraving from his series *Les Bohémiens en marche* shows the Protestant vanguard (*l'avant-garde*) migrating from Bohemia in the aftermath of the Battle at White Mountain in 1620. The image shows entire families leaving the country with all their belongings. A great number of these refugees settled in Protestant Saxony.
